

DAY 01: ARRIVE AT LONDON

Arrival at London Airport. Complete the formalities. Meet the representative and transfer to your central city hotel. Complete hotel check in. time to get refresh Post the same you could begin your discovery of London with a city tour conducted on the original London Double Decker Hop On - Hop Off Tour Bus. (Dependent on flight arrival time) The London tour offers several sightseeing routes that cover all the main sights in Central London with live commentary. Also included in your tour are the free walks and a cruise on the River Thames. The major sights include Buckingham Palace, The Houses of Parliament, Westminster



Abbey, Big Ben, The London Eye, Downing Street, St. Pauls Cathedral, The Tower of London, Trafalgar Square and Piccadilly Circus. The bus tour and route allow you the opportunity to come and go as you please, so that you can visit many of the great attractions around the city such as The Tower of London, where you can see the Crown Jewels including the Kohinoor, or experience to the breath-taking views of the city on one of London's most popular attractions "The London Eye." DAY 02: EXPLORE LONDON CITY BY OWN OR TAKE TOUR OF THREE OF THE UK'S MOST FAMOUS SITES

Breakfast at hotel. Today is your free day to explore the city by your own,



Another option would be to join one of the organized tours (At additional Cost) out of the city. Below is one of our most popular tours that includes a pickup at your hotel. After breakfasting your coach will stop by and you can board from the hotel lobby before setting off to visit three of the UK's most famous sites, Windsor Castle, Stonehenge and Bath - England's most beautiful Georgian city. This tour includes entrance to Windsor Castle, the home of the Royal Family for 900 years, and the world's largest and oldest occupied castle. Windsor Castle's fortified walls dominate the delightful town that has grown up around it over the years. You will see the lavishly decorated State Apartments and St. George's Chapel, travelling further through the rolling green Wiltshire landscape to Stonehenge, where a collection of stones dragged to this lonely plain near Salisbury 5,000 years ago set in a landscape dotted with prehistoric mounds and carvings, Stonehenge continues to enthrall the imagination and captivate the heart of every visitor. Next, it's on to Bath, famous for its elegant Georgian architecture, during the tour you will visit the Roman Baths, the best-preserved Roman spa from the ancient world and pump rooms which is a striking neo-classical salon where hot Spa water is drawn for drinking. Then head back to hotel Overnight at the hotel.



DAY 03: DAY FREE AT LEISURE TO EXPLORE CITY BY OWN OR EXPLORE OXFORD TOUR

Breakfast at hotel A free day to explore city by your own.



Today once again you have an option to join an organized tour (At additional cost) to visit Oxford, with a tour of Christ Church College, with your onboard guide and see some of the locations used from the Harry Potterfilms including the Hogwarts dining hall. You then take a drive through one of the most scenic areas of England the Cotswold's, passing through charming villages with that ched cottages, tea shops and ancient inns. You'll arrive in Stratford-upon-Avon, birthplace of the famous playwright William Shakespeare. You will visit Shakespeare's Tudor-era home, with its typical parlor, bedrooms, kitchen, and buttery. Finally Visit the fantastic medieval Warwick Castle where you will be taken back hundreds of years in history to a time of bloody battles, extravagant banquets and royal ceremonies. See waxwork display from Madame Tussauds and hear the Earl of Warwick as he prepares for the battle. See the gruesome dungeons where prisoners were tortured. Overnight at the hotel.

DAY 04: EXPLORE EDINBURGH BY HOP ON HOP OFF TOUR

Breakfast at hotel. Check out from hotel and proceed for London train station. From one capital to another, London to Edinburgh. (**Train tickets are not included**) Your train departs London Kings Cross at 08.00. You will need to hire a taxi to get there, we would suggest getting there for 7.30, it is not a huge station, and the platform is easy to find. You arrive in the Scottish Capital at 12.30, once again take a taxi to your hotel, where you can drop your bags off and then head off to start exploring the city. You have been provided with the Royal Edinburgh fast track tickets which include travel on four of the main bus sightseeing tours. The "hop on hop off" bus tours give you the chance to see the city from the comfort of an open-air double decker bus but give you the option of leaving the tour if you see something you would like to have a closer look at and picking the tour up later. The three tourist attractions are.

Edinburgh Castle: Edinburgh Castle is built on top of the basalt remains of an extinct volcano proving impressive views of the entire city and beyond. The oldest parts of the castle date back to the Normans but there are buildings and fortifications that cover every period since that time. The castle is home to, amongst other things, the Scottish Crown Jewels, the Stone of Destiny, and the giant 15th century siege gun Mons Meg.

The Royal Yacht Britannia: The Royal Yacht Britannia is magnificent ship and has played host to some of the most famous people in the world. But, above all, she was home to Her Majesty the Queen and the Royal Family. First commissioned 11th January 1954 this floating palace served the royal family for over forty years conveying them to 696 foreign visits, 272 visits in British waters and steamed an unbelievable 1,087,623 nautical miles!

The Palace of Holyrood: The Palace of Holyrood House is the official residents of the Queen and stands at the end of Edinburgh's Royal Mile against the spectacular backdrop of Arthur's Seat. This wonderful example of baroque architecture is closely associated with Scotland's rich history. The state apartments are still used by the Queen and other members of the royal family for state ceremonies and official entertaining. Post the same head back to hotel and overnight stay at hotel.



DAY 05: EXPLORE THE CITY OF EDINBURGH BY OWN OR TOUR TO LOCH NESS, GLENCOE & THE SCOTTISH HIGHLANDS

Breakfast at hotel. Today is your free day to continue to explore the city with your passes.

OR

You have the option to take a tour to Loch Ness, Glencoe & the Scottish Highlands, (At additional cost) covering the magnificent beauty of Rannoch Moor, Glencoe, the Great Glen, Loch Ness and Pitlochry. Leaving Edinburgh, you'll pass Linlithgow Palace (birthplace of Mary Queen of Scots), Stirling Castle and the Wallace Monument, to reach the most dramatic of all Highland glens, Glencoe. This area is steeped in history, and you will hear the truth about the infamous 1692massacre of Clan MacDonald. Journeying through Fort William, site of the military post built during the Jacobite Rebellions in the 18th century, you'll continue up the Great Glen, between Fort William and Inverness. On the way back, you'll stop at Spean Bridge before heading through the Cairngorms National Park, Craig Meagaidh and along the shores of Loch Laggan, where the TV series Monarch of the Glen was filmed. Continuing over the Drummochter Summit, where herds of red deer often graze, you'll visit the Victorian town of Pitlochry. Overnight at the hotel.





DAY 06: EXPLORE THE CITY OF EDINBURGH BY OWN

Breakfast at hotel. Today is your free day to continue to explore the city with your passes.

OR

You have the option to go on the Quest for the Holy Grail (At additional cost) This tour brings Scotland's medieval history to life, but we start with a more modern marvel, the Forth Railway Bridge. As we cross into Fife your guide will tell you about the heroes of Scotland's past who battled in this ancient kingdom. Visit Dunfermline Abbey. Your first stop is the town of Dunfermline. Walk down the beautiful nave of Dunfermline Abbey the final resting place of Robert the Bruce, who battled for Scotland's right to be a nation. Explore Stirling Castle and the city. Into Stirlingshire and we stop at the beautiful city of Stirling, site of the monument of Scottish hero William Wallace (whose life was dramatized in the film Braveheart). You'll have ample time to stroll through the beautiful and ancient streets that surround it. There is also the





chance to explore the stunning castle. Visit the site of Scotland's greatest victory. From Stirling, we head to Bannockburn, the battlefield where Robert the Bruce routed the English in 1314. Decode the mystery of Rosslyn Chapel. The tour finishes with a historical mystery at Rosslyn Chapel, made famous in Dan Brown's novel the Da Vinci Code. Is this the resting place of the Holy Grail No one really knows, but you'll love the chapel and the beautiful walk you can take through Roslin Glen and the ruins of Rosslyn Castle. Overnight at the hotel.



DAY 07: PROCEED FOR INVERNESS

Breakfast at hotel then check out from hotel. This morning you will board your train to Inverness, reaching the highland capital just after mid-day, where you can then drop your bags of at the hotel, and have a great lunch in the city by own, before going for a tour of this historic city. City bus tours are the perfect way to see Inverness is the Capital of the Highlands of Scotland. Recorded history goes back to 565AD. Let us take you to see the historic buildings of Church Street, through the shopping area and

along the River Ness to the leisure facilities at Bught Park. We continue to see the Caledonian Canal Locks and Visit Holm Mills shopping village. Discover Inverness' rich history with City Sightseeing The name Inverness comes from the Scottish Gaelic "Inbhir Nis" meaning the mouth of the River Ness. The Burgh of Inverness was granted a Royal Charter by King David of Scotland in the 12th century and has grown steadily ever since. Inverness is renowned for being the administrative, distribution and cultural center of Northern Scotland and through the last quarter of the 20th century, was one of the fastest growing towns in Western Europe. This was rewarded by Inverness being granted City status at the millennium. The city offers a warm welcome to a lively place with a modern outlook with plenty of things to do and see. Explore the northern Scottish town and all the things to do the open top double-decker bus tour gives an insight into the development of the city from the original street between Castle and Kirk, with the oldest building Abertarff House, to the recently completed Highland Archive Centre. Inverness has had 5 castles through the centuries with many famous visitors, not all welcome, McBeth, Robert the Bruce, Mary, Queen of Scots

and Bonnie Prince Charlie among them. Plan your afternoon from the top of a double-decker bus, with 360-degree panoramic views of the city. Visit the one of many churches including St Andrews Cathedral which is probably one of local architect Dr Alexander Ross's finest buildings. On the Western outskirts of the city the tour highlights Tomnahurich Hill and the Caledonian Canal, where you could hop off for a Jacobite Cruise on Loch Ness before taking the higher ground for great panoramic views of Kessock Bridge, The Black Isle and the Inverness Firth out to Fort George. The tour introduces the flight of 5 locks at Muirtown constructed in 1822 by Thomas Telford to bring the Caledonian Canal to sea level. The final section of the tour takes you by the South side of Inverness Castle to see Flora MacDonald's statue, the 3 Graces, then along General Wades Road by Bellfield Park to Holm Mills shopping village. Overnight at the hotel.



DAY 08: EXPLORE SCOTLAND'S LARGEST CITY GLASGOW

Breakfast at hotel. Today you head off to Scotland's largest city Glasgow. Once again aiming to be at the city for mid-day, the afternoon can be spent viewing the city from above. Your open top bus tour of Glasgow is the ideal way to discover all that is best about Scotland's largest and most colorful city. There are up to 3 departures every hour and you can hop on and off at stops along the route so that you can explore the places of interest that you are hearing about in the commentary. The commentary is provided in English, French, German, Italian, Spanish and Swedish. Tour Highlights: George Square, Glasgow Cathedral, Glasgow Science Centre, The Tall Ship, Glasgow University, Kelvingrove Art Gallery & Museum, Botanical Gardens and Kelvingrove Park The history of Glasgow, Scotland's largest city is rich and diverse. In its 1400 years Glasgow has been a religious community, a salmon fishing village, a medieval university town, a major center of trade with North America and the second city of the British Empire, famed for its shipbuilding and engineering. Today Glasgow is renowned as one of Europe's foremost visitor destinations. Its outstanding variety of museums, galleries and performance venues led to the city being





one of the first to be designated European City of Culture. Victorian Glasgow has left a magnificent legacy of civic buildings that are just waiting to be discovered. Visit the recently refurbished Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum where the highlights include impressionist paintings and wonderful medieval armor. Close by take a walk in leafy Kelvingrove Park or visit the campus of Glasgow University to enjoy the panoramic views from the tower. Back in the city center the Gallery of Modern Art has four floors of exhibition space that attracts visitors and locals alike and to the east the People's Palace, on Glasgow Green, tells the story of the city from the perspective of ordinary working folk. The bustling Merchant City was once home to warehouses and markets. Now it's a sophisticated area of bars, restaurants, and housing. This historic area is home to towering Glasgow Cathedral, which dates from Norman times, the Necropolis where many of the city's wealthy merchants are buried and the Provands Lordship, the oldest building in Glasgow. Glasgow is a city with its own style. A style that is reflected in its modern retail centers (known as "The Style Mile") which attract shoppers from all over Europe. Overnight at the hotel.


